May I be a witness to the Gospel and may all my words and actions reflect your love.



#### What does Scripture tell us about the Family?

#### What does Scripture tell us about the Family?



You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. *Deuteronomy 6:5* 

#### What does Scripture tell us about the Role of parents?

#### What does Scripture tell us about the Role of parents?

#### What does the Church tell us about the Role of Parents?



...parents must be acknowledged as the first and foremost educators of their children. Their role as educators is so decisive that scarcely anything can compensate for their failure in it. Familiaris Consortio 36 and Gravissium

#### What does the Church tell us about the Role of Parents?



On account of the uniqueness of the loving relationship between parents and children [which] is irreplaceable and inalienable, ...the educational role of parents is therefore incapable of being entirely delegated to others or usurped by others.

Familiaris Consortio 36

#### What does the Church tell us about the Family?



Education is thus a unique process for which the mutual communion of persons has immense importance. The educator is a person who "begets" [brings about] in a spiritual sense. From this point of view, raising children can be considered a genuine apostolate. It is a living means of communication, which not only creates a profound relationship between the educator and the one being educated, but also makes them both sharers in truth and love, that final goal to which everyone is called by God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.




Enabling families to take up their role as active agents of the family apostolate calls for 'an effort at evangelisation and catechesis inside the family'.


