

Where are you staying?

The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. When he saw Jesus passing by, he said, "Look, the Lamb of God!" When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, "What do you want?" They said, "Rabbi" (which means "Teacher"), "where are you staying?" "Come," he replied, "and you will see." So they went and saw where he was staying, and they spent that day with him. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus. The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, "We have found the Messiah" (that is, the Christ). And he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas" (which, when translated, is Peter). (John 1:38-44)

Our Parish Reality for Catechesis – getting to grips with the reality of where we are

Statistics:

- Mass Attendance data
- Post catechetical-programme retention rate
- Demographic of congregation vs demographic of parish

Audit:

- Finances
- People
- Previously / well established patterns of working
- Spiritual and emotional position of Parish leaders and congregation in general
- Identifying particular needs in the Parish

Three key questions:

1. What are we doing well? What do we have that is strong?
2. What is the problem? Why is this a problem? Both stating that it is a problem and trying to work out the cause?
3. What would potential solutions look like? Practically, materially and spiritually.
