Statistics:

- Mass Attendance data
- Courses/programmes and people involved in formation (Alpha? Sycamore?...)
- What has changed since Brexit/Covid? Demographic of congregation vs demographic of parish

Audit:

- Finances
- People
- Previously / well established patterns of working
- Spiritual and emotional position of Parish leaders and congregation in general
- Identifying particular needs in the Parish

Three key questions:

- 1. Are there areas of growth in formation? Are there any events, programmes and resources that are currently being used to help people to deepen their faith?
- 2. What do you think is missing?
- 3. If you consider areas of faith formation (e.g. knowledge of the bible, Church history, teaching and morality), which areas do you think that people would most benefit from in deepening their understanding and confidence of faith in?
