

SYNODAL RESPONSES SOUTHWARK

74. At the parish level, Christian hospitality was considered a 'priority' (**P131**), a 'consistent emphasis' on welcome was needed (**I15**) as 'welcome and smiles makes for a sense of family' (**P105**).

A small but significant number of parishes acknowledged that an emphasis on welcome, without a related focus on invitation, can lead the parish to be more inward than outward looking (**P4, P8**).


It was noted that the lack of a church hall or other quality facilities can limit Mission (**AM-KENT**).

The role of groups and programmes that support people in significant life events, such as 'Bereavement and Consolation groups, can draw people to the Church who haven't been before or for a while' (**P15**).

75. **COMMENT:** This lack of invitation and outreach may also be a result of a lack of implied or explicit permission to undertake Mission, 'Many feel like parts of a devoted but passive congregation. They would really like to be involved in the mission of the Church, but do not always feel welcomed, valued or encouraged to do so' (**P20**).

Initiative can be often stifled by a lack of formation, a lack of confidence or a lack of understanding of the lay vocation in the world.

The spaces for catechesis are settings in which the community expresses its own way of evangelising. In the current social and cultural context, it is appropriate to reflect on the specificity of the places of catechesis as instruments of proclamation and of education in human relationships. It is therefore necessary that such environments be welcoming and well-kept, that they convey a climate of familiarity that fosters serene involvement in community activities. The very widespread environments that are patterned after school buildings do not constitute the best places for the unfolding of catechetical activities. It would therefore be good to proceed with an adaptation of these spaces to the actual meaning of catechesis.



It is however true that the dynamic of the Church that goes forth, that goes through catechesis, also has implications with regard to space. Encouragement should be given to attempts at catechesis in different places: the home, the office, educational, cultural, and recreational environments, prisons, etc. These places, which are often more loosely focussed than those of the Christian community, are suitable for casual catechesis because they create more familiar relationships, and in this more visible connection with everyday life catechesis can turn out to be more compelling.
