Evangelisation

How do we define evangelisation?

EVANGELISATION means to fulfil the mandate of Jesus Christ to 'make disciples of all nations' (Matthew 28:19), so that all might respond to the Father's love and be saved through communion with Jesus and his body, the Church. At the core of evangelisation is 'the proclamation of Christ and his Gospel by word and the testimony of life,' which invites conversion, evidenced through faith in Christ, repentance, and full communion with the Catholic Church. Here, we are primarily focused on those activities focused on 'outreach' to the lapsed, the 'lost' (cf. Luke 15:4-7) and those who wish to rediscover their faith.

Catechesis

How do we define catechesis?

CATECHESIS (to 'echo' faith) teaches a knowledge of the faith, including Sacred Scripture and the Church's living tradition. Catechesis helps the believer understand the Church's liturgy, all of which lead one to Christ present in the Eucharist. Catechesis shows what it means to be holy in daily life, particularly in the 'domestic church' where 'children receive the first proclamation of faith' (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 1666). Here, we are mainly looking at the education in the Faith of children and young people towards the fullness of the Christian life.

Here, we focus on activities that help the lifelong process for adults in intellectual, moral and spiritual growth.
