Parish Sacramental Programmes in a time of Pandemic

Each Parish will face a different set of challenges in 2021, including the provision of Sacramental programmes. These might be from the size of the group, the physical suitability of the space available, the number of schools the participants attend, to the availability of your catechists in this time of pandemic. This resource will not solve all your problems, but will hopefully go some way to enabling you to either begin to plan for 2021, or complete your plans.

We have a wealth of free and easily accessed online resources available to us all, and most children and their families will have experienced remote learning in a school setting already. Some degree of provision for online catechesis will give your parish programme the greatest chance of progressing with the least disruption.

Please do take the time to ensure you understand the needs of the group, especially those who come from families who are particularly vulnerable and are limiting interactions with others - your sacramental provision should meet their needs too. We have to acknowledge that some families have limited access to computers and the internet, so if you do decide to deliver everything online, you might have to factor in an alternate method of correspondence (and additional support re delivery) for some families.

Difficult and challenging times can be a moment for real, meaningful and sometimes much needed change. We encourage you to consider if this is a potential catechetical 'reset' moment for your parish. In particular, you might reconsider the role and duty of the family in passing on our faith. Can you support the parents to enable them to take up this role with enthusiasm and joy? Online catechetical sessions to support catechesis in the home present an opportunity for both evangelisation and catechesis of families. In this difficult time, when we are unable to meet in person, the way your parish supports your families will most likely need to change. How might you seek to accompany your families? Is this a change you will want to continue when the pandemic is over? As a diocesan Agency we are very aware that many of our catechists will not have received training in the accompaniment of families, and will be looking to find ways to provide this in the coming months. Guidelines for online catechesis with children

- Diocesan Sacramental Preparation Guidance for COVID-19;
- CSAS Guidance on Safeguarding whilst using Videoconferencing Platforms for Ministry; and
- Using Technology for Online Liturgy, Ministry and Formation guidelines (you will find this particularly helpful if you have not used this technology before).

Before setting up online sessions, either with parents or children, read the **CSAS Safeguarding Guidelines** (available on https://aec.rcaos.org.uk/resources). In particular, consider the following:

- Online sessions should be arranged using a custom account set up with a <u>rcaos.org.uk</u> email address. For example: parishnameconfirmation@rcaos.org.uk. If you need to set these up please email ictsupport@rcaos.org.uk. This account must be accessible to more than 1 person who can act as 'administrator', using a strong password.
- Communication should always be via an 'rcaos' account, it is not appropriate to use personal accounts to contact participants.
- Permission must be obtained from parents to communicate directly with children and young people aged under 16 online.
- When participating in online ministry to children two adult facilitators must be present, one of whom must have read the CSAS Safeguarding Guidelines (available on https://aec.rcaos.org.uk/resources).
- It is preferable to have parents present, and those participating should be in a public space in the home.
- Please also read the guidance for **setting up an online meeting**, which include 'rules of engagement' and guidance on making audio or visual recordings of the meeting.
- Please also read the guidance for **conducting an online meeting** which can be adapted to be shared with those participating.





The course has 12 parts based on 12 sections of the Baptism liturgy and accompanying relevant questions. Can be run over 1 or 2 sessions.








YOUCAT for KIDS

Following on from the very successful YOUCAT, this version of the Catechism of the Catholic Church is a wonderful resource for parents of children during this Sacramental preparation time. If you are asking your parents to be responsible for an increasing amount of direct catechesis with their children this would be one of the best resources with which to provide them.

Don't let the fact that the book is aimed at supporting parents to share their faith with their children post-FHC age, from 8 to 13 put you off. With

instructions on how to use it for parents at the beginning and modern line drawings throughout it is a very friendly format to support parent-led catechesis during FHC and Reconciliation. Widely available through the Redemptorists, CTS and other booksellers.



I Want to Make my Home in You



Margaret Wickware, a catechist in Westminster Diocese, has developed a new resource adapting *I Want to Make my Home in You* (Redemptorist Publications) for parent-led catechesis (below), which works well for remote sacramental preparation. Parent-led sessions (each taking 30 minutes) are based on the *'Lectio Divina'* model. Parents are accompanied through this process and are given suggestions to incorporate their faith into family life. The catechists accompany the

parents who in turn both evangelise and catechise their children.



Included in this resource are everything a catechist will need: ideas for attention-grabbing games; guidance on leading a small group; a full programme for an evangelisation retreat; two or three recommended video clips for each session; a YOUCAT quiz; an examination of conscience; suggested music to use throughout your programme; and resources for 22 short times of prayer.

There are 2 advised pathways for Confirmation - one for candidates and one for parents.

The Candidates' pathway is suitable for those in school Year 10 and above (age 14+) and possibly for those in school Year 9 (age 13+). You have a choice of three different lengths - 6, 9, 12 weeks.

The Parents' pathway is designed to support and encourage parents whose children are preparing to be confirmed. Suggested lengths are either 4 weeks or 6 weeks.

The Sycamore website offers extensive planning advice as well as training for group leaders, for example, how to run a discussion group. In addition, suggestions for additional discussions based on YOUCAT are provided which provide a synthesis of evangelisation followed by catechesis. 

Volume 2: The Sacraments


Volume 3: Life in Christ, Christian Morality


